Derrick Adams creates art that contributes to a more factually accurate and inclusive visual culture. While an elementary school teacher, Adams noticed how imagery influenced his students' ideas of identity and selfempowerment. This observation led to a diverse body of work that uncovers and illuminates concealed histories and perspectives.

Adams discovered Patrick Kelly in 1980s fashion magazines. African American and raised in Mississippi during the Jim Crow era, Kelly became an acclaimed Parisian designer, creating elegant, unpretentious fashions that reflected his character and experiences of Southern culture.

Before Adams created works based on Kelly, he thoroughly researched the fashion designer, relying largely on primary sources. His responses to Kelly's work take the form of mood board collages that form conceptual, abstract visualizations, using fabric swatches and commercially produced home sewing patterns based on Kelly's designs.

Kelly's designs echoed his joyful personality through bold colors and strong, body-conscious lines. His exuberance extended to his unconventional fashion shows, events where models danced, played guitars, and interacted with each other on crowded runways.

Adams explains his series as a conversation with fashion in motion. Look for examples of how this was achieved, beginning with the cover image, *Runway No. 1.* How does Adams describe fashion models moving down a runway? Start your analysis by looking for hints of angled arms swinging from curving figures. Then, search for further evidence.

Next, examine Work Hard, Play Hard, above. How does Adams make use of balance, rhythm, unity, and variety to create illusions of motion and depth?

Apply your discoveries to an investigation of other works in the exhibition. Share and discuss your findings. What similarities and differences do you find among Adams' works?

When Adams was in college, a professor described how artists possess the power to direct and focus audience attention.

How would you make use of this ability? What do you want people to see or understand? Using images, words, or a combination of both, follow Derrick Adams' example and share an awareness that you want to bring to others.

About the Artist and the Exhibition

Derrick Adams' *Patrick Kelly, The Journey* explores the vibrant personality and work of influential African-American fashion designer Patrick Kelly (1954–1990). Kelly was the first American to be admitted to the Chambre Syndicale du Prêt-à-Porter des Couturiers et des Créateurs de Mode, the eminent French governing body of the women's ready-to-wear fashion industry. Adams immersed himself in the Kelly archive at the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture in New York, where he discovered a trove of correspondence, sketches, swatches, photographs, and other memorabilia, including a book proposal about Kelly's life written by his friend, the esteemed poet Maya

Angelou. Adams' works reference Kelly's legacy as a formalist who infused social context and humor into his creations. The exhibition presents Adams' abstract collages and sculptural works that incorporate Kelly's vintage clothing patterns, iconic fabrics, bold and colorful geometric forms, and embellishments.

The exhibition is curated by Alexandra Sachs, executive director of SCAD FASH and Atlanta exhibitions. It is presented as part of SCAD deFINE ART 2020, the university's annual program of commissions, exhibitions, lectures, and performances, held Feb. 18–20 in Atlanta and Savannah. Georgia.
